

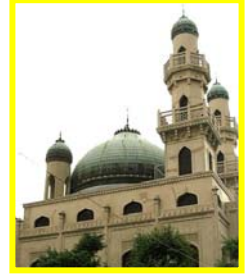

Chapter 2. The best way of asking for forgiveness from Allah.

2070. Narrated Shaddad bin Aus رضي الله عنه (may Allah be pleased with him): The Prophet صلى الله عليه وسلم (may peace be upon him) said "The most superior way of asking for forgiveness from Allah is: "allahumma anta rabbii laa ilaaha illaa anta, khalaqtanii wa anaa 'abduka, wa anaa 'alaa 'ahdika wawa'dika ma-staTa'tu, a'uudhu bika min sharri maa Sana'tu, abuu'u laka bini'matika 'alayya, wa abuu'u bidhanbii faghfir lii fainnahu laa yaghfiru-dhdhunuuba illaa anta."^[1] The Prophet صلى الله عليه وسلم added. "If somebody recites it during the day with firm faith in it, and dies on the same day before the evening, he will be from the people of Paradise; and if somebody recites it at night with firm faith in it, and dies before the morning, he will be from the people of Paradise."

^[1] O Allah, You are my Lord! None has the right to be worshipped but You. You created me and I am your slave, and I am faithful to my covenant and my promise (to You) as much as I can. I seek refuge with You from all the evil I have done. I acknowledge before You all the blessings You have bestowed upon me, and I confess to You all my sins. So I entreat You to forgive my sins, for nobody can forgive sins except You.
